Week 1: Word Analysis

Prefix Study

the prefix “**un**” means “**not**”

social – wanting to talk and be around others	unsocial – NOT wanting to talk and be around others; standoffish
approachable – describing someone who people feel comfortable walking up to or talking to	unapproachable – describing someone who people DO NOT feel comfortable walking up to or talking to
friendly – describing someone who is welcoming and will talk to others	unfriendly – describing someone who is NOT welcoming and usually will NOT talk to others; hostile

Suffix Study

the suffix “**ly**” means “**in the manner of**”

the suffix “**able**” means “**able to**”

friend – a companion	friendly – in the manner of a friend or companion
approach – to walk up to someone or something	approachable – able to go up to someone or something
social – likes to be around others	sociable – able to be around others
